Passing the California Administrator Performance Assessment (CalAPA) meets requirements for both a Preliminary Administrative Services Credential and a Master's Degree in School Administration.

Passing the California Administrator Performance Assessment (CalAPA) is an alternative to writing a thesis/project or passing other assessments (i.e., CPACE and SLLA).

Why Stanislaus State?

- Stanislaus State was ranked No. 5 in the nation for the quality of its master's programs by Washington Monthly in 2016.
- In 2014-15, the Stanislaus State Preliminary Administrative Services Credential Program was ranked No. 2 by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing for the number of graduates who were appointed to their first position in school administration.
